The Charles Composite Squadron Seal



Named after the county in which it resides, the Charles Composite Squadron took as its inspiration the motto of the county itself: "Where Eagles Fly." Hence, in the center of the seal is an eagle, complete with the blue Air Force sweater and flight cap. The eagle is on the move, and carries with him a pair of binoculars and the Maryland flag. Both of these items are in deference to Maryland Airport (2W5), which has so graciously provided the squadron with not only its headquarters but also an active runway. All of the other colors of the seal are thus taken from the colors of the Maryland flag, in whose wing this squadron serves. The motto of the squadron is "spatium emendationi semper est," which translates to "there is always room for improvement." This principle has already been at work in guiding the development and eventual chartering of the squadron, and it will continue to guide the squadron as it performs missions for America.
